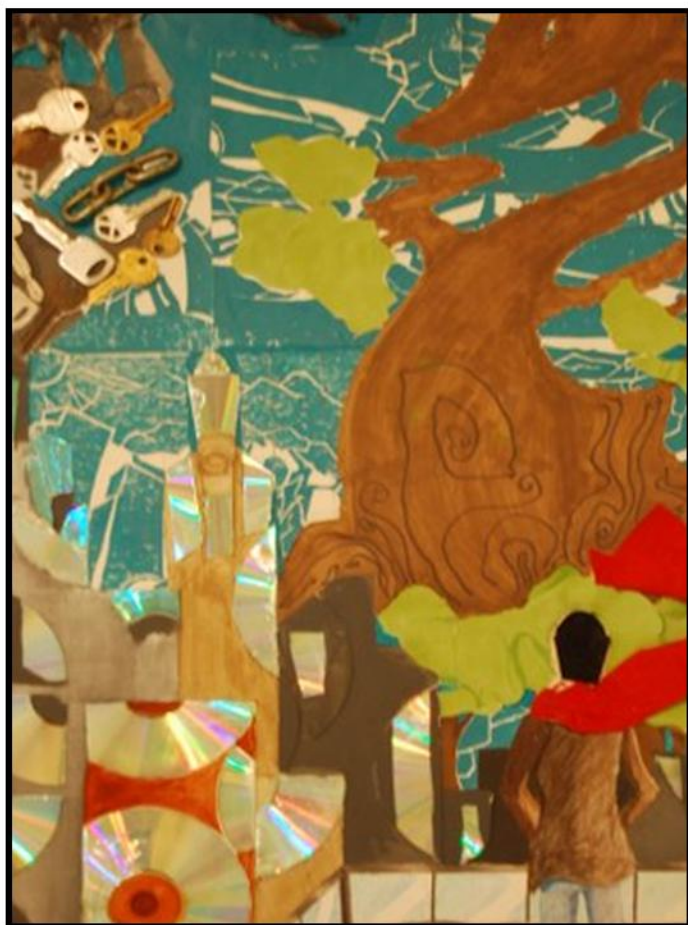

This century old program, housed at the Museum of Fine Arts, offers after-school, intensive art classes for accepted BPS **high school students**.

**Curriculum**

*"Drawing Words & Writing Pictures: From Concept to Finished Product."*

Young Artists will investigate visual art making through the lens of storytelling. They will research "the art of storytelling" through comics, book design, illustrations, and calligraphy. This class will explore a variety of mediums, working in 2D and 3D, perspectives, compositional design, and figure drawing.

Seniors in the program will be given portfolio building assistance.

**Details**

*Classes will take place in both the MFA studio and in the MFA galleries. Students will visit other museums, as well.*

***Students will receive one course credit towards high school graduation upon successful completion of the year-long course.***

The class is aligned with the BPS Citywide Learning Standards and attendance criteria. The BPS/MFA High School Scholarship Program is funded by the Curriculum and Instructional Practices / Arts Department.

All classes, including supplies, are free for BPS students.
